Item	Field # & what you see on the MARC record screen		How the field is useful to you
ISBN	020	\$a 0316107514 : \$c \$12.95	Useful for matching replacement copies.
Dewey #	082	\$a 796.334	Useful for finding the book (and others on the same subject) on the shelf.
Main Entry	100	\$a Brenner, Richard J.,	Usually the author's name.
Title	245	\$a Make the team. \$p Soccer : \$b a heads up guide to super soccer! /	Usually this is simply the title. If a book has a subtitle, it goes under \$b.
Edition	250	\$a 1st ed.	Useful if looking for a specific edition of a book.
Publication	260	\$a Boston : \$b Little, Brown, \$c c1990.	Useful in identifying if the book you are holding is the one you want (Is it the same publisher?). \$c: Copyright date is the date of the edition, not necessarily when work was first published.
Physical Description	300	\$a 127 p. : \$b ill. ; \$c 19 cm.	\$a: How many pages? (Does it hit the "100 Page Mark" needed for many reports?) \$b: Is the book illustrated, does it have maps? \$c: How tall is it? Helps you know the size book you are looking for on the shelf.
Summary	520	\$a Instructions for improving soccer skills.	Describes the book's contents. Does it seem like a book that will answer the question you have?
Subjects	6XX	\$a Soccer \$v Juvenile literature.	These are the words searched when you search the catalog by subject. Looks like: <i>Soccer -- juvenile biography</i> in the catalog.
